The Culturally Rich Delhi

India's capital is divided into two sections, Old and New Delhi. The best period to visit this majestic city is in the pleasant weather months between mid-October to mid-March. Old Delhi is known for its ancient culture, monuments, and its crowded gastronomical lanes. The old city section was founded by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in 1639, who built forts, mosques, mansions, and beautiful gardens. Old Delhi had the first wholesale market selling fruits, herbs, and spices and the first hardware market in 1840.

After the fall of the Mughal Empire (1857), the capital was moved to Calcutta and remained so until 1911. Delhi was developed after change was declared; this is where New Delhi came into existence in 1931. This beautiful Indian capital was designed by and named after the British architect Edwin Lutyens.

The city is enriched by impressive avenues, imperial buildings, and is the home of Gandhi Ji. There is a wide variety of shopping malls, entertainment outlets, cafes and restaurants serving up incredible first-class Indian cuisine. The Metro Rail system allows you to navigate the city and if you opt for taxi's, do remember to negate your fare before jumping in, it's just the way of life here.

Your Cruise itinerary

Day 1 Kolkata and Barrackpore

After a hearty breakfast at your hotel, you will be collected to embark your ship by midday. Sail past the old Danish colony of Serampore to Barrackpore. Serampore used to be hub for Danish traders from 1755 to 1855 in hour of the Danish King Frederick V who ruled Denmark from 1746 1766. Your shore excursion will take you on a walk through the cantonment, past the Semaphore Tower, Government House, the Temple of Fame, and Flagstaff House a reminiscent passage through Indian history.

Day 2 Chandernagore

After a wonderful breakfast onboard, you meander your way to Chandernagore (also spelt Chandan Nagar), known as the "City of Liberty" has an indescribable beauty with a unique blend of culture and heritage. Chandernagore was once, one of the first outposts of India's colonial past up until 1950. Your shore excursion today takes you to the French 18th century Sacred Heart Church (l'Eglise du Sacré Cœur), an architectural masterpiece and Dupleix's House, the erstwhile Governor-General of French India.

Day 3 Kalna

After an early breakfast you sail upstream to the town of Kalna, known as the "City of Temples" and named after the Goddess Kali. Although texts found, date the town to the 6th century, it attained glory under the Maharajas of Bardhaman in the 18th century. Your shore excursion today will be a calycle rickshaw to see a group of 18th century terracotta temples. The shrine complex is an example of architectural excellence and splendour.

Day 4 Matiara and Plassey

After breakfast your first shore excursion will be a visit to the charming riverside village of Matiara, renowned for its brass-works. You get to see firsthand how locals using primitive methods, beating out brass water pots and other vessels. After a great lunch, you are recharged and ready for your next excursion as you cruise on and visit the battlefield of Plassey, where the Commander-in-Chief of British India, Robert Clive defeated the last independent Nawab of Bengal, Siraj-ud-Daulah in 1757, changing the course of Indian history.

Day 5 Khushbagh

After a delicious breakfast your shore excursion will take you to a peaceful Mughal-style Garden that encloses the tombs of Siraj-ud-Daulah and his family. Continuing upstream you arrive at the Hazarduari Palace, roughly translating to "Palace of a Thousand Doors", built by the architect British architect, McLeod Duncan. There are exhibits ranging from Nawab Siraj-ud-Doulah's prized possessions, swords and weapons used during the Battle of Plassey (1757), paintings and rare marble, porcelain, and stucco statues. Next you will visit Katra Mosque, built between 1723 and 1724, and Nashipara Palace before driving out to see the Katgola Palace. At the palaces you will see statues of lions, the symbol of British maritime imperialistic power.

Day 6 Barabagar

After a hearty breakfast you are off on your first shore excursion to the sleepy village of Baranagar visiting three beautiful terracotta temples. The "Char Bangla" temple was dedicated to Shiva by a Hindu queen more than 250 years ago. Rani Bhabani, the queen of Nator, built exquisite terracotta temples. The district incidentally was the capital of undivided Bengal, Bihar and Orissa till the British East India Company defeated Siraj ud-Daula. The Char Bangla Mandir was the most unique among the temples the queen had built. Historians believe that Rani Bhabani ruled over an enormous area that she used to be addressed as 'Ardha Bangeshwar' (Lord of half of Bengal).

Day 7 Farakka Lock

During a delicious breakfast, you cruise to a mooring by the Farakka lock. You disembark and go on a full-day excursion by road to Gaur, near the town of Malda, or English Bazar. This quiet, deserted place was once the medieval capital of Bengal, first under the Hindus in 12th century, then as the Muslim capital of Eastern India from the 14th to the 16th century.

Day 8 Disembark

After a wonderful breakfast you will transfer to Farakka station in the morning for a 4-hour (approx.) train journey to Kolkata. Our representatives will meet you on arrival and transfer you to your central Kolkata resort, the Glasshouse on the Ganges.

This has been the inspiration for Amrit Kashi, the Spa.

Kolkata

Kolkata, formerly known as Calcutta, was founded by the British on the banks of the Hooghly River, Bengal in 1690. A couple of centuries later, the city flourished into the most important trading centre east of the Suez and until 1911, the world's second most important economic hub after London when Britain moved its capital to Delhi. Bengal, renowned for its silk, spices and opium attracted other maritime powers of the time, establishing their outposts along the river.
