Cape town

When one thinks of Cape Town, the most iconic landmark of South Africa, Table Mountain comes to mind. The world-renowned Cape Floral region of the national park is one of the richest floral regions in the world, with over 70% of the flowers are endemic to Table Mountain. If you love outdoor activities Cape Town has a lot to offer, anywhere from abseiling off the top of Table Mountain, hiking, para-gliding, surfing to mountain biking and more. Cape Town has over 300 kilometres of coastline, including two of the largest bays in South Africa – Table Bay and False Bay and some of the worlds most beautiful beaches. Some of the city streets have a striking art appeal and are lined with Afro-chic decor bars and restaurants. With the city's Hop-on-hop-off-30-stop-bus tour service, you can navigate up to 50 attractions at your own pace. Here are some of the exciting excursions you may want to try:

Cape Point

An awe-inspiring full-day tour to the towering headland known as Cape Point with breath-taking views, and historic coastal villages are to be seen along the way. The Cape Peninsula is one of the world's most scenic areas and stretches from the City centre to Cape Point.

Cape Winelands Tour

Head off on a full-day tour to the heart of South Africa's wine industry, exploring Stellenbosch and walk down the canal-lined avenues, in the shade of giant oak trees and beautiful historic buildings.

Tabletop Mountain

Table Mountain, this great sheet of granite cascades dramatically into the Atlantic Ocean. Although there are many trails scaling this 1 km tall peak, the cable car is an easier way to reach the summit.

The Big 5 Safari

An African experience to see Africa's Big 5. You are driven through the scenic vineyards and mountains of the Western Cape to the Game Reserve, where you will be enjoying a 2-3-hour Game Drive Safari with an experienced game ranger.

Great White Shark Cage Diving

An early start day filled with scenic travelling. Leaving Cape Town, traveling towards Gansbaai (about 1h20min drive), you will enjoy splendid views over False Bay, and pass various villages like Grabouw, very famous for its apples and then reach Hermanus.



The Zambezi Queen

Crafted with only wildlife viewing in mind, the sumptuous 28-passenger Zambezi Queen completed her maiden voyage right here on Africa's endearing Chobe River. Peacefully as she drifts up or down the river, animals feel no threat and roam carefree. Perfect for you on this once in a lifetime mega trip. Completely eco-friendly the Zambezi Queen uses an amazing water jet propulsion system, fuel-efficient and low-emission generators, plus an onboard solar heating system. The dining room is fully enclosed with the benefit of air con. A stylish lounge with bar adorn the top deck, including an open-air sun area and plunge pool. The suites boast private balconies enabling you to take full advantage of the unobstructed views across the river and distant landscape. Over the course of the day guests are treated to complimentary local wines, beers, spirits, soft drinks and bottled water. One of the highlights of the trip is your African-themed dinner evening offering traditional dishes and entertainment for all on board. From the moment you step aboard this incredible vessel things only get better. Greeted by the warmest welcome from arguably some of the friendliest and helpful staff you will ever encounter really sets the tone.

Zambezi Queen has all 14 passenger accommodations - 10 standard suites and 4 master suites (fore-location on both cabin decks, cabin numbers 10, 11, 20, 21). Both cabin types are similar as configuration. However, master suites are slightly larger (300 ft² / 28 m²) and with larger balconies (furnished with 2 deckchairs and 1 table). Master suites also additionally feature sliding glass-doors on 3 sides (both side plus front).

Situated on the 3rd level, the dining room offers unobstructed views on three sides. Experience delectable dishes such as butternut and macadamia soup and fillet of beef with bordelaise sauce paired with the perfect wine.

Your Cruise itinerary

Day 1

If you arrive with the 13:00 and 14:00 transfers, you'll be served lunch, while if you're transferred at 15:00 or 16:00 you'll be served a snack before the sunset cruise by tender boat starts. Once all our guests have boarded in the late afternoon, after a safety briefing and if the weather permits, we'll go in search of some big game by tender boat. This is the perfect time of day to make the most of that golden glow of the African sunset by getting some iconic shots of the animals as they gravitate towards the river before night falls. Return back to the Zambezi Queen and freshen up before meeting your host on the upper deck with a welcome drink. After taking in the spectacular scenery, you'll make your way to the dining room where you'll be served a delectable three-course dinner along with an excellent choice of paired wines. Finish off with an espresso or nightcap at the bar before retiring to the night sounds of Africa in the distance.

Day 2

In the early morning you get to choose your activity; some to sip coffee and watch sunrise while others prefer a more leisurely approach. That's the crew aboard Zambezi Queen let you choose your morning activities. Perhaps you want to enjoy a water-based safari or a village tour on the Namibian side of the river? Or perhaps you'd prefer a spot of bird watching or fishing instead? After your morning activities, enjoy lunch on board while using your unique vantage point to spot wild animals and drink in the expansive views. Join the Zambezi Queen's professional guide in the afternoon for a water-based safari on a tender boat where you can get up close to an array of wildlife, including some of the 120 000 elephants for which the Chobe is well known. After a delicious dinner, settle down for a restful and tranquil night in your luxurious suite.

Day 3

After a hearty breakfast, head off to experience those activities you didn't manage to fit in yesterday: enjoy a water-based river safari by tender boat, go bird watching or go fishing for tiger or bream. Return for lunch on board and some relaxation time before the afternoon activities start. Again, you have the choice between tiger or bream fishing, game viewing by tender boat or bird watching. In the evening, you're in for a treat. Enjoy our traditional African dinner, served with festive African singing and dancing. You can even join in the festivities if you feel like it! Hippos are often seen along the banks of the Chobe River, and you will often see them in groups huddled together in defense against predators. Crocodiles also lay along the banks, capturing the sun with their jaws closed and eyes opened. Along the dry grasslands, buffalo herds can be seen grazing, amongst waterbucks and giraffes. You will also see impalas out on an evening stroll and munching on grass without a care in the world. Yellow-billed storks can be seen scouting for small fish, slithering in the water beneath them. If you are lucky, you will also see fish eagles perched on trees with their fish catch. You will feel like you are almost invading their world, but content that wild animals and humans can live together harmoniously.

Day 4

Enjoy a morning cruise during breakfast as you do your last bit of animal spotting and take some memorable pictures. Bid our crew a reluctant farewell and then make your way to Victoria Falls Safari Lodge, located only 4 kilometres from the town of Victoria Falls. The central area features the award-winning MaKuwa-Kuwa Restaurant, the famous Buffalo Bar and a two-tiered swimming pool, all of which offer magnificent sunset-facing views of over African bushveld and our wildlife-rich waterhole. All rooms are spacious and light, with glass sliding doors opening on to private balconies with unrivalled views of the bushveld at sunset. Your room also overlooks a central waterhole, offering the opportunity to observe herds of game quenching their thirst. Each room comes with a Private balcony, Digital safe, Air conditioning and a ceiling fan, Hairdryer, Tea and coffee making facilities, Extra length beds with mosquito nets, Telephone, Customized toiletries including insect repellent and sunscreen, Minibar, International multi sockets An evening of non-stop entertainment includes performances by traditional singers, dancers and drummers, face painting and a four-course dinner featuring local cuisine. The grand finale is an interactive drumming show, giving you the chance to discover your inner African rhythm! There is also a good list of beverages available, including wine and beer. On arrival you will be dressed in a chitenge (sarong), and after being seated, you will have the chance to take part in a traditional hand washing ceremony and sip on a mug of local beer, before tucking into fantastic local cuisine.



Victoria Falls Safari Lodge

Built on a plateau which overlooks the Zambezi National Park, Victoria Falls Safari Club offers luxurious and spacious accommodation with uninterrupted views of the pristine bushveld and spectacular African sunsets.

With a focus on exclusivity, this private facility, which offers personalised butler-style concierge service, provides unforgettable experiences on the doorstep of one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World.

The 20-room Victoria Falls Safari Club has a central guest area featuring a fine-dining restaurant and bar, a lounge and a viewing deck which overlooks the game corridor to the Zambezi River and a wildlife-rich waterhole.

It also has a two-tiered swimming pool, featuring a 15m lap pool and sundeck, and guests may access a modern well-equipped fitness centre.

Part of the Victoria Falls Safari Lodge estate, Victoria Falls Safari Club guests also have easy access to the renowned Buffalo Bar, the deluxe MaKuwa-Kuwa Restaurant and the "must do" Boma – Dinner & Drum Show.

There are 16 luxury Club Rooms and 4 Club Suites, which include a lounge, adding to the feeling of abundant space and comfort.


All rooms, which face the bushveld, feature an open-plan design and are elegantly decorated in earthy tones to blend harmoniously with the African surrounds.

The rooms have two three-quarter beds that may be converted to a king-size bed, sliding glass doors and gauze screens which open out onto a private balcony with sunset views. The bathrooms feature a large free-standing bath and separate walk-in rainfall shower, bathrobes, slippers and a selection of luxurious toiletries.
