

While Route 66 no longer exists, most (85%) of it remains to be driven and explored.

Transport

The city's public transport is easy to navigate, so be sure to purchase a Ventra Card (\$5) which is refundable when you return the card and a daily top up pass (\$10). The speedy "L" trains are perfect for travelling the Downtown Loop, allowing you to grab spectacular views on the some the raised tracks.

Place to visit

River Walk

1.25 mile promenade stretch along the river, full of cafes and bars. You can rent cycles and kayaks.

River Cruise

Get a 1hr 30min guide to the spectacular building, which you can pick up from the promenade.

Navy Pier

Plenty of activities for the family including Shakespeare's Theatre, rides, restaurants and bars.

John Hancock Centre

Enjoy a cocktail on the 94th floor with amazing views across the city.

Willis Tower

At 443m high, you can enjoy the Skydeck with spectacular views.


Millennium Park

Once home to Abraham Lincoln, one of the USAs most beloved Presidents, a trip to the state capital would not be complete without a visit to the house where the Lincolns lived for 17-years. The famous home boast 12 rooms on two floors.

The Abraham Lincoln Museum houses an incredible collection of artifacts including the pocket gloves he wore when he was assassinated as well as the quill pen used to sign the Emancipation Proclamation (the freeing of slaves in the state).

The state legislature proclaimed Springfield as the Chili capital of the world. You will find plenty of parlours with secret recipes downtown.

A must eat is the Horseshoe Sandwich, comprising of your chosen meat, drenched with a delectable homemade cheese sauce.

You may want to try the Giant Pancake for breakfast at Charlie Parker's diner. This 50s& 60s memorabilia joint serves a whopping 16" pancake> You can eat free if you can polish off 4.,

Henson Robinson Zoo


Over 80 native and exotic animals are housed at this non-profit zoo, featuring penguins, vultures, bears, spider monkeys, and lemurs to name a few.

Downtown Springfield is 11-miles (18km) from the campground.


There is a well-stocked convenience store and a propane filling station.

About

St. Louis is situated approximately 96 miles (155km), a 1-hour and 30-minutes drive from Springfield, Illinois.

The city lies on the west bank of the Mississippi and confluence of the Missouri River. It is known for its baseball, beer and its famous arch.

Named for King Louis IX in 1764, the city has not forgotten its French roots, it hosts the country's 2nd largest Mardi Gras after New Orleans.

St. Louis has more free attractions than any other city in the U.S. outside of Washington D.C.

Attractions

Gateway Arch

This parabolic stainless steel arch stretches to a height of 625ft. Eight elevators run up to the observation platform, giving amazing views of the city.

Old Courthouse

This massive dome, part of the Jefferson Memorial Park was built in the 1800s and once the scene for famous trials such as the end of slavery the Suffragettes right to vote.

Botanical Gardens

Dating back to 1859, the gardens comprise of a rose garden, Climatron, Japanese garden and an aqua-tunnel.

Magic House Museum

This Victorian home boasts science, computers and communications. A truly amazing place for the kids.

Old Cathedral (Basilica of St. Louis, King)

Built between 1831-1834, on the site of the first church (1770), the church has complex mosaics, and recent restoration of the dome and bell towers.

Laumiere Sculpture Park

The park features contemporary art in a natural environment. Hiking trails are skirted by woodlands and trees that surround the sculptures.

However, if you want to get the most out of the wonderful city this park is the best solution for your stay.



Springfield lies approximately 216 miles (348km), just under a 3-hr and 30-min drive from St. Louis, Missouri.

Springfield, “Queen City of the Ozarks” is officially recognised as the birthplace of Route 66. On April 30 1926 officials here first proposed the name.

Traces of the Mother Road can still be seen in downtown Springfield along Kearney Street, Glenstone Avenue, College and St. Louis streets and on Missouri 266 to Hall town.

Springfield was the location of the nations first Wild West shoot out. In the town square around July 1865, Wild Bill Hickok and Davis Tutt came face to face resulting in Wild Bill shooting Tutt in the heart.

The background picture is “Pythian Castle”, built in 1913 as an orphanage by the Knights of Pythias and is now a certified haunted castle. Historical tours are available in the daytime and ghost tours at night. Murder mystery dinners and other holiday events are a regular occurrence at the castle.

Attractions

Wonders of Wildlife Museum and Aquarium


1.5 million gallons of water is home to thousands of fish in ocean environments as well as an underwater tunnel where you can admire some river monsters. There is also an extensive collection of 4-D wildlife dioramas, ranging from the African savanna to the Arctic tundra.

Fantastic Caverns

Tour the fascinating underground landscape on a 55-minute jeep-drawn tram ride on America's only ride-through cave system.

Route 66 Car Museum

Brass Era automobiles to classic movie and television rides. Over 70 cars, trucks, and Batmobiles on display, the Route 66 Car Museum includes Jaguars & a German Horch.

The Botanical Gardens are a great spot for a relaxed walk. The youngsters will love the water fountains.

Bricktown is the city's leading entertainment, dining and shopping hub. You can catch a dinner cruise or a simple stroll along the canal.



Attractions

45th Infantry Museum

The Lincoln Park Armory dates back to 1937. The 15-acre outdoor park boasts many vehicles from worldwide conflicts.

Overholser Mansion

Once the grand home of Henry Overholser, the founder of Oklahoma City, this French style chateau features English carpets and French stained glass. You get to walk through the furnished rooms and listen to the tales of the hauntings.

Oklahoma City Zoo

More than 500 animal species including giraffes, rhinos, gorillas, lions and tigers.

About


Amarillo is a small city located in the North of Texas. The drive from Oklahoma City takes just under 4-hours at a distance of 259-miles (417km).

This is a place of cowboys and ranch life. Driving into Amarillo you will see many signs for a restaurant called the Big Texan Steak Ranch, its been on the Route 66 roadside for many years. A great place for a 72oz steak.

Visitors are encouraged to bring along a can of spray paint, to the Cadillac Ranch, a graffiti art covered bunch of cars buried nose first into the ground (background picture).

The nearby Palo Duro Canyon is a Texas treasure, which is full of fun for the whole family. The Zipline Adventure Park is the only zip lines between Dallas and New Mexico. 880ft of sheer bliss with amazing views of the tree filled valleys.

A mile down the 1-40 is the Starlight Ranch, where you can enjoy food, drink and entertainment. However its only open on Friday to Sundays, May through to September.



Attractions

Palo Duro Riding Stables

Grab your cowboy hats and ride with the wind in your hair amongst the oldest and largest cottonwood trees in the Panhandle on a 90-minute ride. Along the ride you will see colourful layers of rock walls that reveal 230 million years of geological history and as well as mules deer's, wild turkeys, and other wildlife.

Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum

Step back in time and get a close look at historic pistols, rifles and arrowheads. Immerse yourself in the tall tales of this corner of the Lone Star State. Play poker in a saloon and tap out a telegraph at the train depot in Pioneer Town. Vintage cars, windmills, fossils and more than 8,000 works of art.

American Quarter Horse Hall of Fame & Museum

The American quarter horse is one of the oldest breeds in the United States, the short, stocky and well-natured horse played a key role in the settlement of the Southwest. Say 'howdy' to the bronze statues of history-making horses in front of the museum. A must see for horse lovers, its informative and full of kid-friendly exhibits

Oasis RV Resort is one of the most amenity-rich parks in the Amarillo geographical area. Not only does the site have an outdoor heated pool that's available seasonally, but it also has two spas, one of which is adult-only and hot tubs. For those who love outdoor cooking, you will love the campground's BBQ grills.

About


Albuquerque is home to the Bosque, the Sandia Mountains, the world famous Rio Grande River and Valley.

If you love trails, the Paseo Del Bosque is one of the best bike trails in the west, running from the north to the south edges of the metro area. It is a 16-mile trail which is parallel to the Rio Grande and runs through the cottonwood forest past Tingley Beach and the Nature Centre.

The Historic Old Town in the heart of Albuquerque has five museums and more than 100 shops, galleries and restaurants. It is a great place to go on a walk about or soak in the distinctive culture. You can find spectacular and uniquely New Mexican jewellery, artwork, housewares, clothing and world-class leather goods.

Food here is a blend of flavours from Spanish and Native American cultures, perfected over 400 years. Some great dishes are the breakfast burritos, carne adovada, green chile chicken enchiladas, chiles rellenos and stuffed sopaipillas.

The International Balloon Fiesta takes place in early October and runs for 9-days. There are around 500 hot air balloons that participate annually.



Attractions

Hike, Tram or Ski Sandia Peak

Offering breath-taking views, Sandia Peak is a sanctuary right outside the city. Adventurers can hike the La Luz Trail to reach the peak. The tram makes a trip every 20-30 minutes and ascends to a height of 10,378ft. If your there during the winter season, the best way down is on skis or a board.

Biopark Zoo

With more than 250 species, the 64-acre Rio Grande Zoo displays animals from around the world in open-air habitats. You can watch animal feedings, attend story time in the Africa Amphitheatre, attend a show or ride the train. There is a fishing lake, botanic garden and an aquarium.

The Indian Pueblo Cultural Center

A world-class museum and cultural centre located just minutes from Old Town and Downtown Albuquerque. Exhibits include a rotating museum exhibitions, artist workshops, lectures, hands-on learning activities and American Indian Arts Festival.

This Route 66 RV Resort is conveniently placed less than 20 minutes west from Downtown Albuquerque on Interstate 40.

There is a Clubhouse onsite which includes a living area with fireplace and flat-screen television, and a fully-equipped kitchen and coffee station. There are a variety of games including a billiards table, poker, Go Fish and a pool table. There is an exercise room onsite to help you get or stay in shape.

Volleyball, pickleball, putting green, picnic tables and grills and a pool. There is a free shuttle service to the hotel casino, bingo room, theatre, kids arcade and a nightclub.


The drive from Albuquerque, NM is around 322-miles (620km) which takes around 4-hours 30-minutes.

Sitting at an elevation of 7,000ft in the high country mountains of northern Arizona, Flagstaff rarely exceeds 90 degrees in the summer. Fall brings a brilliant change of colour, winter snowfall averages and spring bursts with blossoms.

Flagstaff dates back to 1876 with a pioneer legacy that centres on ranching, lumber mills and the railroad. Most of the buildings in Flagstaff's historic downtown area date to the early 1900's and are used today as stores, galleries, hotels and restaurants.

A typical day for someone in Flagstaff is to do something outside; run, mountain bike, rock climb, hike, or walking the dogs.

Downtown offers a local craft brew, music and great food.



Attractions

Walnut Canyon National Monument

Created as a National Monument in 1915 by President Woodrow Wilson, this 3,600 acre site was once home to an ancient civilisation, dating back thousands of years. Whilst hiking the trail you will get to see how their dwellings carved into the cliffs as well as breath-taking views of the canyon. Before embarking on this trail, make sure your fitness is up to it as its some 200 step climb, which is pretty exhausting for some.

Lowell Observatory

Peer through world-class telescopes and sit in on lectures offering topics like black holes and Pluto. Researchers at the observatory were the first ones to discover Pluto. Great at night when the stars are at their brightest.

Sunset Crater Volcano National Monument

Around 900 years ago, the volcano known as Sunset Crater erupted, transforming the encircled landscape. Lava rock and lava flow compose the topography, The Park include a 1-mile lava trail hike, a truly incredible awe inspiring experience.

Woody Mountain Campground has RV slots available with large pine shaded trees in a fresh natural setting.

The campground is seasonal and is open from April through October.

At the front of the campground is a cafe, camp store, and sandwich shop. The campground is located on Historic Route 66.

Fuel is available at a Chevron station located just a few blocks to the east of the campground. The Chevron also has diesel fuel.

Williams is a small town lying 56-miles North of the Grand Canyon's South Rim. Your drive from Flagstaff is around 33-miles (53km) which should take just over half an hour.

The town, considered the gateway to the Grand Canyon is home to the Grand Canyon Railway. Trips depart from the Williams depot daily, allowing travellers several mid-day hours to roam the Grand Canyon Village at the South Rim (background picture).

Don't miss the nightly shoot-out downtown at 7:00 p.m. from Memorial Day to Labour Day in which classic Old West "outlaws," the Cataract Creek Gang, get killed (civic boosters prefer the term "plugged") as hundreds of "witnesses" (visitors) look on. The bad guys dressed in their cowboy hats and spurs, bounce back and come back the next day to perform their evil deeds again.

History buffs can explore more than six blocks of historical buildings and shops bursting with memorabilia. Restaurants offer a vast choice of home-cooked dishes to the deep-fried and showcase delicious Mexican, Italian and American fare

Attractions

Grand Canyon Railway Adventure

Enjoy kaleidoscopic views of the San Francisco Peaks aboard a refurbished vintage train that departs and returns to the Williams Depot several times a day. You will enjoy the same views of the deep pine forests as they did in 19021, while immersing yourself in the chugs of the train engines on this spectacular 65-mile (105km) journey.

Bearizona

Take a bus ride through this amazing wildlife park set on 160 acres in the Ponderosa Pine Forest. If you prefer to walk, there is 20-acres of winding pathways in a zoo-like setting. The park is home to the High Country Raptors, African wildlife, North Pole experience, aquarium and much more.

Route 66 Zipline





Aquarium of the Pacific


