Mystic Seaport Museum

The nation's leading maritime museum with world-class exhibitions of history, art and indoor galleries and is home to the last wooden whaleship in the world. The museum also has a Planetarium.

Mystic Aquarium

Sanctuary to thousands of animals including beluga whales, sharks, stingrays, African penguins, and more. There are two 3-D theatres where you can watch sea lions do performances.

Saltwater Farm Vineyard

A coastal property of 100 acres, featuring a renovated WWII vintage hanger opening onto terraces and a vineyard. There is a tasting room with regularly scheduled live music.

Farmers Markets



Founded in 1654, Mystic is a premier tourist destination of Connecticut, primarily down to its prominence in the "Clipper Ship" building era. Today, Mystic renowned for its New England charm is home to 2 of Connecticut's most visited attractions, Mystic Seaport and Mystic Aquarium.

Situated on opposite banks of the River Mystic, it comprises of 2 towns, Groton and Stonington. The first 2 English settlers were Robert Burrows and George Denison who farmed land on each side of the river. The first Mystic Bridge connecting the 2 towns was built in 1819, however, the bridge has since been replaced by the current Bascule Drawbridge installed in 1922.

Candy coloured buildings line Main Street in downtown Mystic, home to cafés, restaurants and shops. From classic American to Italian, seafood staples and sweet bakery treats it's a foodie's dream.

There are plenty of waterfront activities for the family that include kayaking, paddleboards, drive your boat or catch a Schooner for great views of islands and lighthouses while sailing the river. You can even bring your picnic basket with you. There are plenty of old rustic bars to keep you entertained come to the night-time. Just a short distance from Maine Street is Capt. Daniel Packer Inn, a cosy little historical place where you can sit next to the log fire and enjoy live music.

Boston

Massachusetts

About

Boston is just under 100-miles (160km) from Mystic, CT which is around a 1-hour and 45-minutes' drive.

Boston is rich in history. The very name came from a town in Lincolnshire, England where many of the settlers came from in 1630, and the name never changed.

Many revolutionary wars occurred or near Boston. In 1776, British Forces were forced to evacuate Boston due to General Washington's fortifications and cannons on Dorchester Heights, overlooking the city from the south. Under the orders of Washington, Brigadier John Thomas secretly led forces and workers to Dorchester Heights and began fortifying it. To cover the construction noise, American cannons began a lot of cannon fire from another site and by morning a dozen cannons were in place, completing the required firepower. British warships positioned in the harbour planning to destroy the stronghold realised they were now in an indefensible evacuated their troops and loyalists and left to the safety of Halifax, Nova Scotia. This brought an end to the eight-year occupation of the city.

The historic area of downtown Boston is where you will find the city's iconic landmarks, historical markets, restaurants and favourite nightspots. Don't be surprised if you see costumed re-enactors walking down the street, while there.

There are plenty of historical taverns and Irish pubs in the area around Faneuil Hall Marketplace which adds up to a very lively night. However, don't expect Happy Hour prices as it's been banned in Boston since 1984.

Attractions

Freedom Trail

16 important sites adorn the 2.5-mile Freedom Trail that was key to American freedom and civil liberties. In addition to the Revolutionary and Colonial war sites, there is the USS Constitution "Old Ironsides", famous for its role in the war of 1812-1815, declared on England by President James Madison.

Tea Party Ships & Museum

A guided 1-hour tour takes you back to a momentous night in December 1773 leading up to the American Revolution. Fully costumed actors, interactive displays, and high-tech ensures an immersive experience, bringing to life the time and events of that evening.

Boston Theatre District

Restored historic theatres with incredible performances can be found downtown. Choose from avant-garde productions, Broadway shows, Ballet performances, comedy, kids shows and more.

Winter Island Park is just minutes northeast of downtown Salem. It is the nearest RV Park to Boston which is a rail ride of only 30-minutes. The MBTA station is 2-miles from the campsite.

The Park also has fishing and boating. Its recreational resources are extensively used by both Salem residents and non-residents and include a public beach, a playground and a pier.

The park has one fee-free bathhouse, centrally located, with bathrooms and showers that are open 24-hours a day. The Winter Island Office and Store is towards the waterfront and provides necessities including snacks, drinks, and toiletries.

White Mountains

New Hampshire

About

The distance from Boston, MA is about 163-miles (262km), around 2-hours and 40-minutes.

The White Mountains, New Hampshire's name was given by 17th-century settlers due to the sun's reflection off their crystal faces to the valley below. The mountains have long been known as some of the most beautiful scenery in the eastern United States.

Waterfalls, relaxing swimming holes and a host of wildlife, such as moose, white-tailed deer, black bears, loons, fox, turkey, and rainbow trout, it's the perfect place for hikers. There are thousands of trails that can be explored. The White Mountains Trail, designated as a National Scenic Byway, runs for 100-miles looping sections of the 800,000-acre forest past the region's attractions.

Peaking 6,288ft, Mount Washington (called "Agiocochook" by Native Americans) is the highest mountain in north-eastern North America. Just off Rte. 302 Bretton Woods, is the Mount Washing Cog Railway. It was the world's first cog railway to climb a mountain. Doubtful it could be built, the New Hampshire legislature gave the builder the right to build a "railway to the moon". Today you can ride "Old Peppersass" right to the summit just as it first achieved in 1869.

Attractions

Gateway Arch

This parabolic stainless-steel arch stretches to a height of 625ft. Eight elevators run up to the observation platform, giving amazing views of the city.

Old Courthouse

A massive domed building, part of the Jefferson Memorial Park was built in the 1800s and once was the scene for several famous trials such as the end of slavery the Suffragettes right to vote.

Botanical Gardens

Dating back to 1859, the gardens consist of a rose garden, Climatron, Japanese garden and an aqua-tunnel.

Magic House Museum


This Victorian home boasts science, computers and communications. A truly amazing place for the kids.

Old Cathedral (Basilica of St. Louis, King)

Built between 1831-1834, on the site of the first church (1770), the Cathedral has complex mosaics. A recent restoration of the dome and bell towers have transformed it to its original majestic form.

Laumeier Sculpture Park

The park features contemporary art in a natural environment. Hiking trails skirted by woodlands and trees surrounding the sculptures.

Adirondacks

New York

About

The Adirondack Mountains are home to the largest protected natural area in the lower 48 of the United States. The Adirondacks are made up of twelve distinct regional destinations, each offering their brand of Adirondack adventure.

The Lake George region boasts charming towns and villages that offer a unique blend of the Adirondack Region's rustic heritage with the Gilded Age's elegance. With more than 300 cafés, bistros, restaurants and pubs to choose from – you are sure to find something to please each palate.

There are 4 popular trails in the area which are Tongue Mountain (18 miles of marked trails), Berry Pond Preserve (an easy walk through pristine wetland and open water wilderness), Black Mountain (for the fit, a 5.6-mile loop with stunning views located near Huletts Landing), and Feeder Canal Towpath Trail (a 9 miles scenic and historic trail gives a behind-the-scenes tour through Glens Falls).

Take a romantic hot air balloon ride over glittering lakes, or fly unfettered on a parasailing excursion. There are several fishing charter-services which can be found in the Lake George Region, providing guided expeditions to fishing hot spots.

Attractions

Glen Falls Children's Museum

One of New York's unique interaction exhibition centres, offering youth and family programmes. Nearby, the Adirondack Folk School in Lake Luzerne continues the Adirondack crafts tradition where you can learn how to make traditional north woods twig furniture, pack baskets and Adirondack Chairs.

Lake George Steamboat Ride

Choose from a variety of cruises that range from 1 to 4 and a half hours, complete with the Captain's narration. Lunch, brunch, or family dinner journeys are available.

Battlefield Park in Lake George

Explore the site of a historical battle between the Algonquin and Iroquois, the Battle of Lake George (1755) during the French and Indian War, and an American hospital during the Revolutionary War. The park also has ruins of a British stockade and Fort George, a British stone fort that was abandoned before it was completed.

Fort William Henry Museum

Step back in time and experience what it was like to be at the outpost in 1757; on the front line in defence of the British Colonies from French invaders. Chat with the uniformed guides and experience the French and Indian War. The musket and cannon fire demonstration add excitement to the visit.

About

The RV Park near Elmira, NY takes about 3-hours and 40-minutes' drive Lake George, which is 241-miles (388km).


Elmira lies on the Chemung River, near the Pennsylvania border. The first European settlement (1787) was incorporated as the village of Newtown in 1815 and renamed Elmira in 1828 for the daughter of an early settler, Nathan Teal.

The Battle of Newtown on August 29, 1779, during the American Revolution, saw General John Sullivan defeat a combined British and Indian force led by Sir John Johnson.

During the Civil War, Elmira hosted a Prisoner-of-war camp; dubbed by inmates as "Hellmira" due to poor living conditions. Woodlawn Cemetery has nearly 3,000 confederate inmates who died there. Mark Twain, the writer, publisher and lecturer, is also buried there.

Mark Twain the renowned author wrote many of his books here, his wife was Elmira, New York. You can visit his octagonal study on the grounds of Elmira College.

A visit to the Clemens Centre is a must. On the Powers Theatre and Mandeville Hall stages, the Clemens Centre presents a vast array of performances, from blockbuster Broadway shows and dazzling dance programs to rousing classical and contemporary concerts.



Attractions

Elmira Trolley Tour

"The Elmira" takes you on a one-hour narrated historical journey through the largest neighbourhood of Victorian homes. On your tour, you will discover Civil War history and the sites that inspired Mark Twain to pen many of his renowned books.

Corning Museum of Glass

Showcasing 3,500 years of glassware, the museum is the world's most comprehensive and celebrated collection. You can watch live glassmaking done by the experts, and even learn to make glass yourself.

Farmland Animal Park

An 18-acre family farm in Wynkoop Creek Valley of Chemung. It has one mile of roads for you to stroll through, visiting a variety of animals including horses, cows, llamas, pigs, goats, sheep, chickens, turkeys, ducks, peacocks, emus, and donkeys along with their offspring. You will also enjoy the creek that runs through the park and the pond that inhabits animals on its island. Pony rides are also available.

Other activities new for this season are paddleboat rides and chicken egg picking. This is a great family day outing which will keep the kids occupied for hours!

Gettysburg

Pennsylvania

About

Elmira, NY to Gettysburg is about 210-miles (338km) which takes around a 3-hour, 40-minutes' drive.

Founded in 1786 by Samuel Gettys, an early settler, Gettysburg is primarily known for its battlefield of the Civil War. After a great victory over Union forces at Chancellorsville, General Robert E. Lee marched his Northern Virginia Army into Pennsylvania in late June 1863. On July 1st at the crossroads town of Gettysburg, the Confederates clashed with the Potomac Army of the Union, commanded by General George G Meade. On July 3rd, General Lee ordered 15,000 of his troops to attack the Union's centre at Cemetery Ridge, known as "Picketts Charge". After penetrating the Union's line, they eventually failed, resulting in thousands of casualties. General Lee was forced to retreat his battered army on July 4th, towards Virginia. The lives of 51,000 soldiers were lost on both sides. The battle was considered the turning point of the conflict, even though the war continued for another two-years.

Today, tourism is the main industry. The historical sites such as Gettysburg National Military Park (including the Gettysburg National Cemetery) and Eisenhower National Historic Site are the largest crowd pullers.

Every year from July 1st to July 3rd volunteers re-enact the Battle of Gettysburg. Each day re-enactors display a different part of the battle, complimented with commentary about the hardships of the battles. The battles are narrated by battlefield guides of the Gettysburg National Military Park.

Attractions

Gettysburg National Military Park Museum


Everything you need to know about the American Civil War can be found here. The museum features items from one of the largest collections of Civil War relics in the world in 22,000 sq. ft of exhibit space. Relics of the Battle of Gettysburg and personalities who served in the Civil War, inter-active exhibits, and multi-media presentations that cover the conflict from beginning to end as well as describe the Battle of Gettysburg and its terrible aftermath will keep you glued with intrigue and excitement.

Gettysburg Ghost Tours

Gettysburg Ghost Tours & Gettysburg Paranormal Association offer an excellent array of opportunities for you to get up close with the spirits of the dead. The Haunted Field Hospital Tour features homes and churches that once served as makeshift field hospitals.

Eisenhower National Historic Site

Gettysburg was also home of President and Mrs Dwight D. Eisenhower, it's the only one they ever owned, which he bought after his retirement in 1950, following a 30-year career in the army. The house is furnished as it was when they used it in the 1950s. This weekend retreat is where foreign dignitaries such as Winston Churchill, Charles de Gaulle, and Nikita Khrushchev were entertained.

Washington DC

District of Columbia

About

The drive from Gettysburg to DC is just under 85-miles (137km), around one and a half hours.

Washington DC was founded in 1790. The site was chosen by President George Washington and he appointed Charles L'Enfant, a French-born engineer, architect and urban designer to prepare a vision for the Grand Capitol.

On the 24th of August, 1814, British troops entered Washington in retaliation for the American attack on York, Ontario in 1812. President James Madison has fled to safety, leaving the Whitehouse empty. The soldiers helped themselves to food from the scullery, ate then set the mansion ablaze. Historical letters from Madison's wife "Dolley" say that the President left to meet his generals in the battlefield.

The city increased in size after the Civil War. In 1901 the McMillan Plan (Senate Commission) was introduced to complete L'Enfant's original plan.

According to the American Institute of Architects, half of the 12 architectural gems that line the National Mall are American's favourites.

DC is filled with so many free museums, from Smithsonian's including the National Museum of African-American History and Culture, the National Museum of Natural History and the National Air and Space Museum, to art-filled museums like the National Portrait Gallery and the National Gallery of Art.

The Washington Monument (555ft tall), named after the first President is the tallest structure in the city, as it legally has to stay so. The doors have reopened in 2020 after a 3-year renovation, so now you get the chance to climb it.



Attractions

International Spy Museum

Receive your own cover identity to test your Spy skills throughout the museum. Come face to face with spies and spymasters, gadget makers, scientists, and engineers from past and present. Take a closer look at the hundreds of imaginative inventions used to steal secrets. Try your hand at code-cracking and discover sabotage and lethal action and so much more.

The National Archives Building & Museum

Home to over 3 billion records including the most important, the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights. These can be viewed in the building's Rotunda for the Charters of Freedom.

About

The drive from Washington DC to Charlottesville is around 117-miles (188km) which takes around 2-hours.

Pinpointed in the Blue Ridge Mountains of central Virginia, Charlottesville has first-rate museums, galleries, wineries and parks. The many rivers and lakes offer the perfect setting for sailing, swimming, fishing, kayaking and tubing.

Charlottesville is probably best known as the Monticello masterpiece home of President Thomas Jefferson (picture background). Jefferson moved into the house in 1770. He held the Presidency of the United States from 1801 to 1809. He was the primary draftsman of the U.S. Declaration of Independence in 1776.

The Court Square building downtown has been used as a courthouse for over 200 years. No other courthouse has been used by 3 early American Presidents at the same time. The original wood frame courthouse was erected in 1762. Local elections were held here and the County Court conducted business with the help of young attorneys and magistrates such as Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe. These men along with James Madison later became Presidents and could at times be seen here together.

When the British attacked Richmond in the summer of 1781, the Virginia General Assembly made Charlottesville its temporary emergency capital and met here for deliberations.

You will find charming boutiques, antique shops, antiquarian bookstores, and nearby small towns nearby filled with pleasant surprises.

Attractions

Michie Tavern

This 18th Century tavern has a rich history. In 1774 the proprietor was Corporal William Michie, who signed the Albemarle Declaration of Independence, and persuaded most of his politically motivated patrons to follow suit. The Declaration refused allegiance to Great Britain's King George III. Today you can dine or drink at the pub of this incredible vibrant place and earn more about its fascinating history.

Jefferson Vineyards

A country-style setting where you can taste award-winning wines and experience this beautiful place. Sitting between Monticello and James Monroe's Highland, its only 10 minutes from Charlottesville. Bring a picnic basket and enjoy a leisurely lunch on the hillside, complimented with an excellent bottle of wine from the vineyard.

James Munroe's Highland

Explore the estate of James Monroe, the United States' fifth President and its last founding father. Thomas Jefferson encouraged Monroe to buy the land adjoining Monticello. Here you can learn about Monroe's contributions to the early American republic.


The Misty Mountains Camp Resort is roughly around a 20-minute drive from downtown Charlottesville.

Charlottesville to Williamsburg takes just over 2-hours at 121-miles (195km).

Founded in 1699, Virginia's capital was once called Jamestown and renamed to Williamsburg in honour of England's reigning monarch William III. It was America's first planned city, which can be seen by many of the beautiful Capitol buildings. In 1780 the capital was moved up the James River to Richmond, where it remains today.

Themed around 18th-century living, Colonial Williamsburg features unique wartime experiences, historical taverns, theatrical interactions with the colonial-dressed town folk. This stunning city also features contemporary attractions like Art Museums, U.S. Army transport museum, Mariners Museum and Virginia Ari & Space Museum.

In 1781 General George Washington assembled his army for the siege of nearby Yorktown. His victory over British forces led by Lord Charles Cornwallis would mark the end of the last major battle of the American Revolution. This battle cemented George Washington's reputation as a great leader, paving the way for his election as the first President of the United States.

In 1926, John D. Rockefeller, Jr invested heavily into the restoration after being approached by Reverend Doctor W. A. R. Goodwin.



Attractions

Colonial Williamsburg

Immerse yourself in American history from where it all began. From blacksmiths, carpenters, foundry, gunsmith, military activities to colonial medicine and much more. The pipes and drums and old carriage rides are mind-blowing.

Yorktown Battlefield

Spend 3-hours and step into the Battlefield where General George Washington and his Armies fought. There is a 15-minute orientation video of the "Siege at Yorktown" and you can also buy an Audio Tour (1-hr and 15-mins) of the 7-mile Battlefield (CD) to listen while you walk in the footsteps of soldiers fighting for independence.

Fort Monroe

Dating back to 1607, the land is known as "Old Point Comfort" that now includes Fort Monroe was a key defence site at the mouth of Chesapeake Bay. Colonists settled here in 1607, The Fort, first built in 1730 and later destroyed by a hurricane. It was later rebuilt 1819-1836 and remained a Union stronghold throughout the Civil War. President Abraham Lincoln visited and spent 4-nights in the quarters.

New Bern North Carolina

About

New Bern, NC is about 195-miles (314km), 3-hours and a 30-minutes' drive from Williamsburg, VA.

Founded in 1710 by Swiss and German immigrants, named in honour of the founders' home Bern, Switzerland.

George Washington's first official birthday celebration took place in New Bern, dancing in Tryon Palace, the home of past Governors. Tryon Palace, a lavish Georgian masterpiece, named after the British Governor William Tryon until the Revolutionary War. According to the national archives, George Washington was born Feb. 11, 1731. But in 1752, Britain and all its colonies switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar, which moved Washington's birthday a year and 11 days to Feb. 22, 1732.

New Bern has 3 historic districts dating back to the 18th century. Markers on the houses show where the elected assembly in the colonies used to meet in defiance to the Crown of England.

Before the Revolutionary War, pirates visited New Bern and terrorised the shoreline. Nearby Beaufort has one of Blackbeard's houses, "Hammock House", purportedly where his men and wife stayed when on shore leave. His ship "Queen Anne's Revenge" was discovered off Beaufort's coast.

In 1890 a Pharmacist, Caleb Bradham invented "Brad's Drink" now known as Pepsi-Cola.

Tryon Palace

Stroll through more than 14 acres of sculpted gardens, or travel back in time for an interactive experience that blends the 1830s with 21st-century technologies.

North Carolina History Centre

60,000sq ft centre featuring the Pepsi Family Centre, interactive displays, cultural, economic and natural events that shaped the coastal landscape of North Carolina.

Christ Episcopal Church

In 1752, England's King George II gave the church silver communion service, a prayer-book and a bible, which are on display. The Gothic Revival steeple stands tall on the New Bern skyline.

The Pepsi Store

Visit the birthplace of Pepsi-Cola, and learn about the history of its inventor Caleb Bradham.

The Firemen's Museum

The oldest fire company in the state of North Carolina. Learn all about the Great Fire of 1922, which destroyed roughly 1,000 buildings in the New Bern downtown area and see the ancient fire equipment up close.

Myrtle Beach is around 172-miles (277km) from New Bern, NC, which takes about 3 and a half hours drive.

In 1670 English settlers founded Charles Towne (now Charleston). By 1716 an English/Native American trading post had been established at Hobcaw Barony. Rice and indigo were widely planted, however, Edward Teach (a.k.a. Blackbeard) and his 40-gun ship, pillaged many vessels until his capture in 1718.

In 1740 President George Washington visited the area, staying at the oldest tavern owned by innkeeper William Gause. By 1840 the area produced half of the U.S. rice crop production.

The state's official dance is known as "The Shag", named after the Pad Shag Club around in the 50s, frequented by teens seeking nightlife fun.

This year there are new attractions opening, such as the Boogie Board Racer, featuring over 60 world-class rides, a waterpark and live shows. Carnival Parade from June 13th to July 5th. Community Arts & Brewery Centre, featuring handmade beers and restaurants. Trampoline Parks such as Flip N Fly Myrtle Beach and Big Air Myrtle Beach, with over 50,000sq ft of family fun.

Voted one of America's top gardens, Brookgreen is a unique melting pot of art, history and nature.



Savannah is Georgia's oldest city, founded in 1733 by General James Oglethorpe, a British philanthropist and Member of Parliament. His statue is in Chippewa Square. Admired for his benevolence towards a Native Indian tribe, "the Yamacraw" befriending their leader. The Battle of Chippewa 1812-1815 was commanded by General Jacobs Jenning Brown whose army defeated the British invasion in upper Canada. Chippewa Square was also the famous movie scene shot of Forest Gump sat on a bench.

It is also home to the founder of the USA Girls Scouts, Juliette Gordon Low.

Beautifully manicured parks, Spanish moss-draped oak trees, horse-drawn carriages and ornate antebellum architecture is one of the reasons its most visited cities in the South.

The Pirates House is a must-visit. It first opened in 1753 and was an Inn where pirates and seamen drank. It is now a great place to eat some amazing Georgia cuisine while looking at the pirates' artefacts.

Downtown you will find the historic district, famous for its cobblestone streets, beautiful gardens and magnificent architecture. You can take a trolley to discover historic houses and churches.

Colonial Park Cemetery

These 9,000 grave cemetery dates back to 1750, the final resting place for its early citizens including Button Gwinnet, a signatory on the Declaration on Independence. It was also used as a campground by the Union Army in the Civil War, bullet holes are still visible on some of the headstones.

Forsythe Park

In 1586, Sir Francis Drake arrived from England with 2,000 men and plundered the area. English buccaneers again attacked in 1665, 1702 and 1740 initiated by the governors of Carolina and Georgia. In 1763, Britain reigned supreme over North America after taking Florida from the Spanish and Canada from the French. However, in 1784 were forced to return Florida to the Spanish, who later ceded it to the United States in 1821.

As the nation’s oldest city, this is The Place for history buffs, 400 years of it. Stroll the narrow lanes, enter the many museums, visit landmarks such as Castillo de San Marcos, Ponce de Leon’s “Fountain of Youth” and the Oldest Wooden Schoolhouse.

Historic District streets are lined with historical homes, cathedral, museums, boutiques and restaurants.

From swashbuckling adventures to specialised tours in the air, on the sea, and in the heart of the historic district, Saint Augustine has it all!
