About

Copenhagen is a city best experienced by bike. Every day, 49% of Copenhageners commute to work on a bike. This northern Europe metropolis ranks as the world's best city for cycling and locals take pride in getting around on their two-wheeler.

Bycyklen (The City Bike) is synonymous with Copenhagen. This is a public bike share and available all over the city and is easy to use. The city bikes are intelligent electric bikes that are available 24/7, 365 days a year. Each bike has a touchscreen tablet which can be used for navigation, payment and guidance to points of interest in Copenhagen and Frederiksberg. To use the bikes, you must create a user account. Create a Bycyklen account online at www.bycyklen.dk or directly on the bike tablet. It only requires name, email address, telephone number and payment card information.

Public Transport

If you want to reach Nørrebro, Vesterbro, Frederiksberg, Osterbro or other areas of Copenhagen, the metro is the best option. The Copenhagen Card gives you unlimited public transport in the capital region of Denmark plus free entry to over 80 museums and attractions. It is available for a 24, 48, 72 and 120-hour period, costing €54-133 for adults, with a version for children 10-15 years old costing less. Parents note: one adult can take two under 10-year-olds to museums and attractions for free, and two under 12-year-olds on public transport for free.

You can also buy a City Pass, a digital travel ticket for unlimited public transport over a 24, 48, 72, 96 or 120-hour period, costing from DKK 80 for 24-hours for unlimited travel in Copenhagen zones 1 to 4, including the airport. There is a version for adults and another for children over 12 years old. Buy online and remember to keep your phone charged.

Eating out in Copenhagen

Long known as a culinary hotspot boasting Michelin stars (the world's best restaurants), and the New Nordic cuisine movement, the city is also a foodie-friendly destination for budget travellers. Some of the best budget eateries are GRØD, Hooked, Minimer, Gasoline Grill, California Chicken, GAO, John's Hot Dog Deli, De Gallo Pizzeria, La Neta and The Bridge Street Kitchen.

For a truly Danish food experience, for lunch, you can try the renowned smørrebrød (open-faced sandwich). But at dinner, you should treat yourself to some other Danish classic dishes loved by locals. Some of the traditional Danish eateries are Lumskebugten, Aamanns 1921, Restaurant Palægade, Restaurant Koefoed, Aamanns Etablissement, Restaurant Kronborg, Restaurant Kompasset, Schønnemann, Sans Souci Restaurant and Wine bar, Fleisch, Christianshavn's Ferry Café and Restaurant Kanalen.

Entertainment

No matter where you find yourself in Copenhagen, you're never far from a world-class beer bar to help you quench your thirst. The craft beer scene is constantly brewing and makes Copenhagen a heavyweight destination when it comes to great beer and beer bars including the ones that double as breweries and gastropubs. The "værtshuse" (pubs) are the classic places to enjoy a beer.

Here are some great outlets you may want to try, Mikkeller Bar, Kølsters Tolv Haner, BRUS, Nørrebro Bryghus, Mikkeller and Friends, Baghaven, Søernes Ølbar, Dia'legd, Dorf's Gastrobar, War Pigs, Ølbaren, Dorf's Gastrobar, People Like Us and Mikkeller Beer Celebration Copenhagen.





Nights 1-7



Helsingør

On your drive to Helsingør, you can stop by “Fredensborg Palace” (Denmark’s Versailles).

Helsingør also is known as “Elsinore” is surrounded by The Sound (Oresund) — the stretch of water between Denmark and Sweden. Separated by only 4,000m (2.5 miles), you can catch a ferry ride which takes only 20-minutes.

Helsingør is a very historical charming place where you can find castles, museums, churches, beaches and forests. It is home to the world-famous “Kronborg Castle”, Shakespeare’s Hamlet, which formed the foundation of the city’s prosperity for more than 400 years.

Today, Helsingør Shipyard has been rebuilt as Kulturværftet (the Culture Yard), a dynamic cultural centre with concerts, theatre, festivals, the main library and a maritime museum. The harbour connects the old castle with the heart of Helsingør, where well-preserved historic houses are situated alongside an array of shops, café and restaurants.

The shipyard’s street food market is a great place where people of all ages gather, enjoy and explore the amazing foods from Denmark and across the world.

Fredensborg Palace

It is the regents most used residence. This stunning 18th-century baroque palace was built as a hunting palace for Frederik IV and is today often the setting for large official state visits and family events of the royal family. On select days in July and August, you can visit the Palace Gardens. It is around a 40-minute drive from Copenhagen on your way to Helsingør.

Elsinore Walk

A guided city walk you can do by yourself by picking up a free guide book from The Culture Yard in one of the city’s museums. The walk will lead you through Elsinore’s 800 years of history. Follow the trail of blue dots that mark the route in the cityscape. You will be led to 20 cultural attractions all of which are marked with a sign and a number.

Kronborg Castle (background picture)

Dating back to 1420, the castle became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in the year 2,000. This is the actual castle that Shakespeare set Hamlet in! Shakespeare called Kronborg Castle Elsinore. There are guided tours that run every day.

Helsingør Camping is an urban campsite in beautiful surroundings with the city's best beach and with good fishing opportunities.

The camping site has covered outdoor dining, which also has TV in the evening. Here is the place to play games, enjoy your lunch or enjoy a great Danish beer. The Kiosk additionally provides the sale of newspapers, groceries, hot sausage with bread and ice cream waffles with jam and whipped cream. The site provides bicycle rental, and volleyball.

The campsite has 100 units with electricity for all units. The space units are divided into red and blue. The blue ones seats closest to the water and the red ones are distributed on the rest of the square.

You can also try the new sauna hut.

Nearby Places of Interest

The Øresund Aquarium
 Located in Elsinore (a short walk from the Castle of Kronborg and the Danish Maritime Museum), this is a small and professional saltwater aquarium focusing on Danish marine life. You can experience the fantastic world below Øresund's surface and touch sharks, crabs and sea stars; you can catch crabs and watch the sharks being trained. During the summer months, you can join the aquarium's guides on whale watching trips and experience Denmark's small whale, the harbour porpoise.

Fishing
 The site is attractive to anglers as it is only a 5-minute walk to Nordhavnen, where most fishing boats sail from. For anglers, the campsite can offer a fish kitchen drying room freezing options.

About

Nykøbing Sjælland is a market town in northern Odsherred on the island of Zealand. The town centre to the white sandy beaches of the Kattegat is just 2 km away. Being a popular summer place for the Danish, you will see a lot of beautiful cottages extending from Rørvig (old fishing village) in the east to Klint in the west. Rørvig has a lovely broad sandy beach with dunes, facing the Kattegat Sea on one side and the forest Sandflugtsplantage on the other. A great place for hiking or cycling.

Although the town is small, Nykøbing offers an impressive range of speciality shops, supermarkets, café and restaurants.

Vig is a charming town in Odsherred. Vig town centre includes Odsherred's only cinema, the "Vig Bio". It also serves as a café and eatery with a vibrant atmosphere. Also, nearby Vig is the Vig Tuske- & Kraemmermarked (Vig carnival & flea market), the Hempel Glass Museum, featuring the largest private glass collection in Northern Europe, or the well-preserved castle ruins from the Middle Ages at Kelstrup Ruinen.

Near Vig is the Odsherred Zoo Rescue, housing 600 exotic animals representing over 100 species, including camels, zebras, ostriches, kangaroos, emus, and llamas.

Attractions

Nykøbing Sj Psykiatriske Museum

A psychiatric hospital that was built with a maximum-security ward, part of which was turned into a museum. If you are looking for something weird and different, this is a place to visit.

Ulvborg Historical Workshop

Located in Asnæs, a town in Odsherred, its Denmark's only experience centre where you see Danish history through the period between the Viking Age and the Middle Ages. Here, everyone can take part in building, forging, spinning and cooking. Ulvborg is a reconstructed environment around a fortified big man's farm with associated workshop buildings, gardens, and livestock.

Odsherred Fire Museum

100 years of history that's going to be a hit with the kids. They can even ride on a fire truck on certain days. There are around 20 rescue vehicles as well as equipment. A day the kids can feel like they are firefighters.

Odsherred Camping

The most picturesque drive to Vig is to follow the coast through Gilleleje, Tisvilde, Liseleje to Hundersted where you will take a 45-minute ferry to Rørvig.

Odsherred Camping ground is a short drive from Rørvig. The campsite is within easy walking distance to Nykøbing Sjælland, the main commercial town in Odsherred with a pedestrian street, cafes and many shops.

The campsite has an eastern and western part, the eastern being smaller of the two. On the western side, you will find the reception, playground and the lounge area. Both sides have showers, toilets and a kitchen. Bathrooms for families require a special card which can be obtained in the reception.

The child-friendly white sandy beach is only 200m from the camp and there are several walking and cycling trails in the Odsherred area.

About

The port town of Korsør is located in the Slagelse municipality. In the summer months, the harbour waters are blue and bright with fishing boats. Korsør is a fascinating place – boasting the oldest, still operating movie theatre in the world, a harbour and beautiful beaches.

Surrounded almost entirely by water, Korsør has the feel of an island. The great bridge arches across the Great Belt, and the tide splits the town in two – the Korsør Nor inlet and the Halskov side.

History buffs must swing by the Korsør Isbadsmuseet. The view from the museum allows you to admire the perfectly framed Great Belt Bridge.

The Korsør Fortress is also well worth a visit, it's russet-red tones are a stark contrast next to all the blue of the water. Korsør is believed to date back to the 13th century.

Down on the Korsør Marina, the jetties are lined with boats, bicycles rentals and the nearby beach boasts pristine waters for a summer's day splashing. There are 13 beaches dotted around Korsør, ensuring that everyone can find their perfect little paradise.

The restaurants lining the harbour are also the perfect spot for tasting the freshest fish Korsør has to offer. Restaurant Lystbaadehavnen is a firm favourite thanks to its bridge views and wonderful wine list.

At the National Museum, you can walk the ramparts of a real Viking fortress and learn about village life in the idyllic Danish countryside.

Learn all about the Vikings' seafaring ways and nautical nature at the Vikingeskibs Museet or Ship Museum. A truly must see!



Faaborg

Faaborg, Denmark

About

Faaborg - the gateway to the South Funen Archipelago and one of Denmark's oldest and most beautiful markets.

The idyllic market town is steeped in history with its cobbled narrow streets, well-preserved old merchant's houses and the Bell Tower - the landmark of Faaborg.

Gold frames are erected in the town, from May 1st to November 1st, so you can experience the nature that gave the artists inspiration for their works.

Vesterport (the West Gate) - the last remains of a medieval fortification with ramparts and moats surrounding the town. The gate is built of heavy, red brick with dog-tooth gables to the east and west. The upper part burnt down in 1728 and was restored in 1770 and 1917.

At the harbour, you can hop on one of the three ferries that go to Bjørnø, Lyø, Avernakø and Ærø or paddle out in a kayak or jump in the fjord from the harbour bath.

It is worth a visit is to the "Kanonerne ved Voigts Minde" (historical guns with stunning views).

The Prison Museum

Here you come close to both history and the present in a Danish prison-house. Come in and break out! With the new offer in Arresten, families with children can see if they can break out by following the tips they get from previous inmates. Do you manage to prison break before closing?

Faaborg Camping is situated in the middle of the nature with direct access to Svanninge Hills and Mountains, close to Faaborg City and the gateway to the Archipelago.

Activities include horse riding, water tours in Svanninge Bakker, bicycle tours in the Archipelago, island hopping and more.

The camp is only 17km from the stunning "Egeskov Castle", built on oak piles driven into the bed of the lake. It is said that a whole forest was felled to provide timber for the foundations.

Faaborg Camping is owned by Lone and Torben Kjærulff and their boys, Nikolaj and Rasmus. The couple is the one meeting you at reception, and who mow the grass, clean the toilets and always ready to help when needed.

Places of Interest in Faaborg

The art museum Faaborg Museum was created a hundred years ago by Mads Rasmussen, councillor of State and factory Owner. The history of trade and commerce is shown in a former merchant's house in the street, Holkegade near the Bell Tower.

The cultural history can be found in the Bell Tower and "Den Gamle Gaard", which together with the rest of Kaleko Mill are part of the archipelago museum. In the village of Nørre Lyndelse, you can visit the famous composer Carl Nielsen's childhood home. Numerous manors and castles have throughout history been built in the area, where the most well-known and most visited is the beautiful Egeskov Castle. In addition to this, you can also visit Japanese gardens, parks, ancient monuments, art, galleries, churches and buildings of historic interest.

Maribo

Lolland, Denmark



About

Take the ferry from Faaborg to Aeroe Island, lunch in Aerøskøbing. Then take the ferry out to Rudkøbing, drive across Langeland and take another ferry to Tars and drive to Hestehoved Beach, outside of Nakskov for a late afternoon swim. Then enjoy a relaxed drive to Maribo.

Maribo is the main inland city of Lolland., dating back to the 15th century.

It is also home to Maribosøerne, among Denmark's most outstanding natural areas. Maribosøerne is the common name for the lakes: Søndersø Lake, Røgbølle Lake, Hejrede Lake, Nørr esø Lake and the surrounding hinterland, all rich in wildlife. The four lakes are located in an area of magnificent manor houses, surrounded by fields, meadows, marsh and forest land, and has many ancient monuments.

Maribo's cathedral, which has three aisles, was built by Denmark's first female head-of-state, Queen Margrethe, who lived from 1353 until 1412.

The Open-Air Museum allows you to go back in time and feel the ambience, visiting the old half-timbered houses and discovering what rural life was like back in the old days.

Attraction

Knuthenborg Safaripark - A Wilder Experience

Get close to rare Siberian tigers, go on safari among the giraffes and wildebeests on the savannah; say hello to the world's largest animal, allow yourself to be astonished by the giants of past in the dinosaur forest and let loose on Denmark's biggest nature playground and meet the former circus elephants in what is probably Europe's largest elephant enclosure.

Anemonen - The Tour Boat

Pleasure boat trips on the Maribo Lakes. Maribo Søndersø is Denmark's eighth largest lake and without doubt the one with the most islands. The water areas cover 890 hectares of which 40 hectares are floating reedbeds and 35 hectares are islands and islets.

Møns Klint

About

When you cross storstrømmen on highway E47, take the exit to Farø, then road 287, crossing the island Bogø onto Møn. This will take you on route to your next and final stop, camp Møns Klint.

Møns Klint is a great place for anyone who loves nature. The cliff rises 128 meters above sea level and a 7km stretch of coastline. The sight of the cliff testifies to the enormous forces of nature that have created Denmark.

This unique natural setting is home to plants and animals that do not exist elsewhere in Denmark. The high calcium content found in the soil provides the perfect foundation for 20 species of wild orchids in the area.

The degradation of the cliff gives the water a distinctive blue-green colour, and it also has exciting fossils from the past wildlife.

For a great night out, there is the “Pier to Heaven”, Located on the small yacht haven of Clintholm next to the lifeboat station. It is an amazing little bar to rest up in after a long day of activities, or walking along the famous white cliffs of Møns. There is a great outside seating area where you can watch the yachts and fishing boats come and go into the busy little harbour.


Attractions
